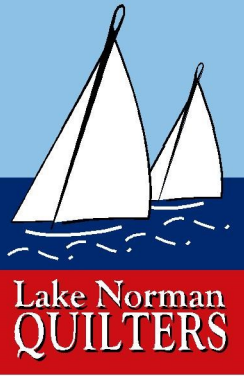

During the past year our guild donated a total of nineteen baby and child quilts to charities. Five of the baby quilts went to the Baby Bundle Program, which gave the quilts and other baby necessities to active duty personnel at Fort Bragg, NC. Fourteen of the quilts were given to Lake Norman Regional Medical Center. The hospital was thrilled to receive our handiwork and distributes them to their ill babies and children.
