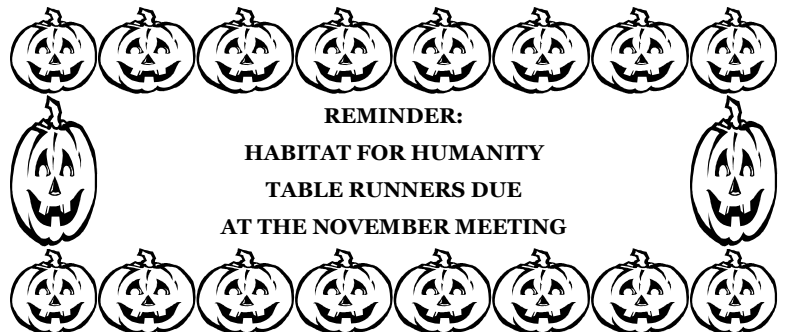

Lake Norman Quilters General Meeting Minutes OCTOBER 2010

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by Sandy Palmer, President. Susan D-L introduced Carry Langhorne-Caldwell, the guest speaker for the evening. Carry's presentation was her journey into art and fiber art. She showed us many of the photos she used to make fabric portraits of people, many were her children. The garage sale project was explained. Margaret Wills will have the garage sale open for the members before the meeting, at break and after the meeting. The members may bring in items that they have priced to sell that evening. 20% of the proceeds will go to the guild's scholarship fund and 80% will go to the member. The members are to take home any unsold items at the end of the meeting.

De Lane Rosenau said all challenge UFOs are due at the December meeting. The person with the most finished challenge UFOs will be given a prize. De Lane also explained the guild's new Scholarship program. Members of the committee are De Lane, Grace Howes, and Dale French. Application forms were handed out at the meeting and will be available at the library cart. To qualify for a scholarship the applicant must be a guild member. These scholarships are for workshops given by LKN Quilters Guild. There will be one scholarship for each workshop in the amount of \$35.00. If the workshop costs more than \$35.00 the member is responsible for the difference. If the workshop is less than \$35.00 only the amount of the workshop will be paid. Applications need to be turned in two months before the workshop so the committee has time to review the applications, etc. A member may have a scholarship once from Jan - June and from July - Dec.

Liz McNabb announced that the Doubles Challenge are now due in Dec versus the Nov date. Liz also gave a quilt show update. She will be obtaining three bids on the donation quilt. Two new categories were added. One is for a new quilter - a person who has been quilting less than 2 years. The other is a group project. Dottie Jensen and Deanna Johnson will be giving a workshop on paper piecing for making the quilt show ribbons and for members who have not made their name tags at the church from 1000 until approx 2:00 on Dec 4..

Susan D-L announced a workshop in January which will be five mini workshops of 90 minutes each. In February Susan B-K will be giving a workshop on whole cloth painting. Look for more info on these workshops in the newsletter or on the blog. Susan B-K gave an update on the blog which is LKNQuilters.wordpress.com. There is an About Us page, a PDF of the last newsletter, pictures of the last quilt show, etc.

Susan B-K also discussed some areas of consideration when renting out the guild's quilt stands. The issue of liability needs to be addressed. Susan received some e-mails recommending that the guild not rent their stands because of this issue.

Barbara Barrier gave an update from the nominating committee. All positions have been filled with the exception of secretary. Camille Schiavone volunteered to be secretary.

We had one guest and no new members. There were 47 people present for the meeting. The Sep minutes were approved.

Dolores Fobare stated we had received \$1,000 from the day guild for the rental of racks and had a balance of \$8,521.63. \$250 of the \$1,000 is a security deposit. Camille Schiavone gave an update on the AQS book order. It was recommended that this item go on the blog. The polka dot fat quarters were won by Charlotte Soutullo. Next months fat quarters are to be stripes. The \$15.50 raffle was won by Dottie Jensen. Dolores announced that anyone wanting a tax record for their donation to the soup kitchen put a check in the donation bag. Dolores also announced dues of \$20.00 are due next month. Barbara Barrier won the maple leaf blocks. Next months blocks are to be 12" and made from Christmas fabric. Dottie Jensen announced that this is the last rotation for block in the box and that all the blocks are to be brought to the next meeting. Colleen Thraikill showed us the cut Halloween bags that had been made for children hospitalized for Halloween. She will award a prize for the cutest bag next month. Table runners are due next month for Habitat for Humanity. Left overs will go to the Restore for sale. We had a wonderful show and tell. Respectfully submitted by Judy Whitehead's asst.

15. It calms the nerves, gratifies the soul & makes me feel good!

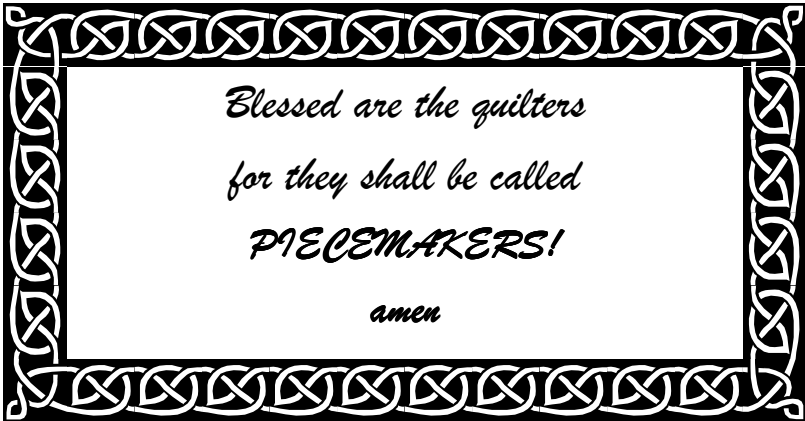
