
2015 – 2016 Mystery BOM

Month Four – December 2015

Our fourth block is the “Turnstile” block. This will be a 6” finished block.

You will need to make three (3) of these blocks for the quilt.

Your fabric choices this month are to use your background, medium light and dark fabrics. I used the same three fabrics in all blocks for visual consistency this month.

The cutting instruction graphics show the number of patches you need to cut. For piece A in your medium light, you need 4 triangles for each block, so you would cut two (2) 3-7/8” squares and sub cut those once on the diagonal to get your 4 triangles for one block.

Piece B will require four (4) background triangles and four (4) dark triangles. From your background, cut one 4-1/4” block, then sub-cut twice on the diagonal to get four pieces that will lay with straight of grain on the outside edge of your block. Repeat this with your dark fabric.

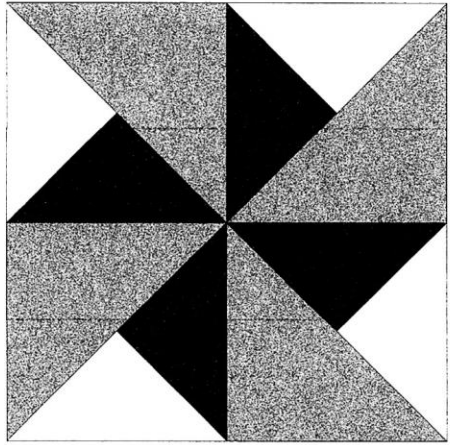
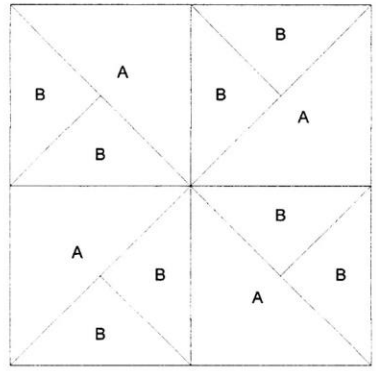
This gives you the twelve pieces needed to make one block. Repeat this twice more for three total blocks.

To piece, follow the layout provided. I pieced this using chain piecing techniques. Piece all your B triangles into pairs to form larger triangles following the diagram (pay attention to your color placement). Then add your A triangle, this makes squares that are then pieced like a four patch.

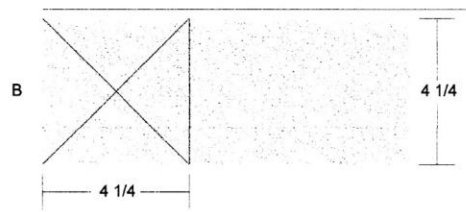
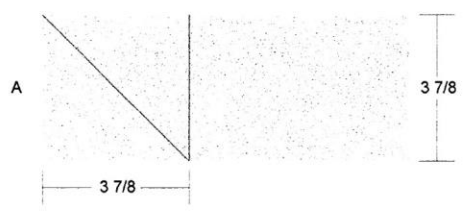

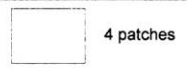
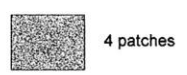
Key Block (41/100 actual size)
