

Meeting Minutes

LNOG Minutes – March 23, 2021

The meeting was called to order by our President Jill Daly-Huston and was held as a Zoom meeting beginning at 7:00 p.m.

There were 16 members present, including a new member Cynthia Walsh. Welcome Cynthia!

Annette Rogers announced the Guild would be having its first live presentation in May. We will welcome Pam Carter, who has a new quilt shop in Gastonia located on New Hope Road called Just Sew Happy. Pam used to be affiliated with Quilter's Loft in Mooresville when it was located near exit 33 prior to its closure. Details will follow.

Members are anxious to get back to programs and workshops, and some possibilities were discussed. Annette was given some ideas for persons to contact, including vendors that were planning on doing programs for the Asheville Quilt Show which has been postponed until fall. Also suggested were Yadkin Valley Quilts (Tim and Andrea), and Rene' Crowder. Judy Mikilitus and Annette are both teaching classes at a retreat and may be able to teach those classes as Guild workshops, and Cindy and Patty with Quilters Gallery may be contacted as well for a class on their Kaleidoscope pattern.

With indoor, in-person meetings being planned now the safety precautions were discussed again. New guidelines in the state at this time will allow up to 50 persons indoors, so all Guild members could potentially participate if they are comfortable. Masks would be worn, temps taken, spacing of seating organized, and windows in the church can be opened for fresh air and ventilation. Those present at the meeting agreed with all recommendations for a safe return to in-person meetings indoors.

Judy Whitehead was asked to explain the donation quilt process in preparation for our Quilt Show in the spring of 2023. Judy advised the procedure in the past has been for the Donation Quilt Committee to come up with 1-3 patterns of interest, and then present them to the Guild at a meeting to be voted on. The normal time-frame for the preparation, work, and completion of the quilt has been 6 months. When the quilt is finished, pictures must be taken and marketing of the Donation Quilt can begin.

Kim Townsend, who volunteered to be part of the Donation Quilt Committee has asked Tracey Galmon to assist her. Any other members willing to volunteer are welcome. Judy Mikilitus has agreed to organize the distribution of the tickets, and Mary Jo volunteered to help her.

Jill requested that Kim and Tracey come up with some patterns for the quilt for the next meeting.

Members asked if Jean Cable could still print out the tickets for our Donation Quilt. Sandy Palmer volunteered to ask her, and the members present agreed that we would pay her for the materials as well as her time (when she was a member of our Guild she volunteered her time, but she is a member of the Day Guild only right now).

The Round Robin quilting project was discussed further by Judy Whitehead. Interested members are to complete a central block for their Round Robin quilt by the May meeting. **Bring your completed central block to this meeting!!!** The central block can be any pattern, and the size of that block will then determine the size of the quilt in the end (for example, the bigger the central block, the bigger the quilt will be). Each month, beginning in May, Judy will give out a clue of what to do or add to the next border. Each clue will be up for interpretation of each member, and members can make their own decisions on how to construct each border to be presented at the next meeting. As clues continue, members can decide to add as many of the borders as they want, or even skip a month and combine clues into one border if they want to. Again, members should bring their in-process quilts each month. Somebody joked that if someone doesn't get a clue done before the next meeting they must bring chocolate to share instead 😊

Jill announced that her new sewing room is finally done, and she will give a tour of it during our next meeting in April (which is still scheduled at this time as a Zoom meeting). We are excited for Jill!

Dolores Fobare advised the Guild's checkbook balance is currently \$6,586.76.

Jill will check with her contact at the church, Julie, to schedule our in-person meetings again.

The meeting was adjourned at approximately 8:30 p.m.




